## What it Costs

## What you get

One week of camp at beautiful Woodland Lakes in Amelia, Ohio! Your youth will work with wonderful camp counselors who have undergone training in youth leadership and been thoroughly cleared to work with youth. Camp is also supervised by our "Camp Parents" – Lori McDonough from Northwest, Sarah Tyo from Williamsburg, and Kyle Hudson from ECC, all of whom have much experience working with youth. Activities include the pool, lake obstacle course, zipline, giant swing, campfire activities, archery, Bible study, crafts, games and more! Our group will be sleeping in an air-conditioned lodge with bunk beds. There are 2 large bunk rooms for girls and 2 for boys, with adjacent bathrooms and showers.

## Medication

ALL medications MUST be turned in to a camp director at check-in. Please list the medications and directions on how to take the medications. Please only send the amount of medication needed for the week.

All medications (prescription or OTC) must be in the original container.

## Cell Phone Policy

We do allow campers to bring their cell phones to camp. However, they must surrender them to the camp directors upon check in. **\*Don't forget a charger!** We will make sure that the phones stay in a safe location and campers will be given access to their phones in the evening for about 15-20 minutes to call home. ## COVID-19 Protocols

To keep camp running as close to the "good old days" as we can, we are requiring that ALL campers, regardless of vaccination status, submit a negative COVID test upon check in. This test is allowed to be an "at home test" and must be administered within 48 hours of check in at camp.

Also, in the past we have allowed campers to leave and come back to camp (eg. for baseball games, doctor appointments, other sports events.) We are discouraging this as much as we can. This limits any possible exposure that would happen while leaving camp. If you HAVE to leave camp for a day for an event we, please let us know in advance and we will advise as we see fit, on a case by case basis.
